

According to the National Hospice and Palliative Care Organization (NHPCO) and the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), one out of every four dying Americans is a Veteran. Hospice of Orange & Sullivan Counties is the leading community resource for providing patients and families with compassionate physical, emotional, and spiritual end-of-life care with comfort, dignity, and respect.

As part of our mission to care for and honor Veterans, Hospice of Orange & Sullivan Counites, offers Veterans the opportunity through our Hospice of Orange & Sullivan Counties Veteran Program, to be honored and thanked for their service.

Each recognition is tailored to the patient's and family's preference, which may include a pin, a certificate of service, a patriotic blanket (hand-made by a local crafter), a Thank You card (made by a child from one of our local communities), and an Honor Salute. We continue to create partnerships with Veteran organizations throughout Orange and Sullivan Counties to provide these salutes to honor our Veterans.

The committee is made of hospice staff and veteran volunteers who work together to maintain all criteria needed for this accreditation.

As part of our commitment to specialized care for veterans, we offer the Honor Salute/Recognition Program. This program could not continue without the dedicated support of community members, including. Veteran organizations, local quilters and crafters, and our local schools and youth organizations who provide handmade Thank You for Your Service cards.

November is Hospice Awareness Month

As your trusted community resource for providing patients and families with compassionate physical, emotional, and spiritual end-of-life care, we understand the difficulty for many who struggle with the decision to place loved ones in our care.

When a family is coping with a serious illness and a cure is no longer possible, hospice provides the type of care most people say they want at the end of life: comfort and dignity, with the wishes of the patient and family, always at the center of care.








June 14th Veteran Annual Celebration
